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Stop Press! Lycée de Sèvres wins Top Prize at the European eTwinning Conference

The European Commissioner in charge of Education, Training and Languages, Jan Figel and the Austrian minister for Education, Science and Culture, Elisabeth Gehrer, awarded the first series of eTwinning Prizes on Friday 13th January at the prize-giving ceremony which was held at Linz in Austria at the annual eTwinning conference.

The competition was divided into three categories, pedagogical collaboration, pedagogical innovation and use of digital technologies. There were two age groups in each category: pupils from 5-12 years and 13-19 years.

All the partners nominated presented their projects at workshops and exhibited their work in the hall of the conference centre which drew together 400 participants.

In the category of Pedagogical Innovation (13-19), the First Prize was awarded to the Lycée de Sèvres and its 5 partners in the Club Philo Project "Europe, Education, School": the classical lycée Ludovico Antonio Muratori (Italy), the lycée J. G. Tajovski of Banska Bystrica (Slovakia), the lycée Matyas Lerch of Brno (Czech Republic), Dzukuja d'Alytus School (Lithuania) et the lycée n°VII of Peristeri (Greece).

The project, created and supervised by M. Czeslaw Michalewski has allowed on-line exchanges (ICT) between pupils and teachers on the role of culture, education and schools in the Europe of tomorrow. For this project, video-conferences are organised and on-line workshops using digital technology.
